## Behaviour, well-being and personal development

My child is happy at school
Strongly agree - 48%

My child feels safe at school
Strongly agree - 46.7%

My child has been bullied and school dealt with this quickly and effectively
Strongly agree - 14.7%
Agree - 17.3%

Strongly agree - 20%
Agree - 62.7%

Behaviour is good at school

### Summary:

- 92% parents surveyed say their child is happy at Edale and their child feels safe at school
- 90% parents surveyed feel their child has a sense of belonging at school
- 90% parents surveyed feel that behaviour at school is good.

### Actions:

- EDIB lead to continue to establish a parent partnership group and links with other schools to continue the work on diversity and representation
- School to carry out a pupil voice for after school clubs they would like school to consider
- School to continue to use RE days as a way of exploring the faiths and cultural backgrounds of our Edale children.

## Summary:

- 95% of parents surveyed felt their child is doing well at Edale
- 88% of parents surveyed felt school has high expectations of their child
- 95% of parents surveyed felt that school provides a wide range of subjects within its curriculum
