# Supporting your child's learning at home

Your child brings home reading and spellings each week. Please ensure they read their book at least 3 times a week; the more they practise, the more fluent they will become and this will support their learning in school across all areas of the curriculum.

All children in years 2-6 have a log-in for Timestables Rockstars. Please encourage your child to access the app to practise their timestables, as knowing these facts fluently supports in all aspects of maths. It is especially important in years 3 and 4 and children will take the multiplication tables check assessment in summer term of year 4. Please see your child's class teacher for more information.

### **Attendance**

Our attendance target for all children is 96%.

When children's attendance falls below this figure, it significantly impacts children's attainment at school and their ability to 'catch up' with missed learning. The more time children take off, the wider the gaps become and the harder it will be to achieve what they are capable of.

Last half term we achieved 95.4%
