Key Priorities

Edale's curriculum is well established and in a strong position. In the recent Ofsted inspection, the HMI praised it as ambitious and well sequenced. To improve further, Edale will streamline and refine its intent so that progression maps and knowledge organisers explicitly map out the specific things children will learn (i.e. what they will know by the end of each unit and what they will retain moving forward). This is to ensure that there is greater consistency across subjects in what children retain from units. Work in books is strong and reflects the Take Care ethos of the school and this will continue to be developed with a focus on producing curriculum products. A robust schedule of spaced retrieval should be established in order to children to have orchestrated opportunities to revisit prior learning to ensure long term retention, especially in science and humanities. Subject leaders should continue on their journey to establish ownership of their subject in terms of both design and implementation.

Key Actions

All units in every subject to be revised to ensure knowledge objectives are explicit and prioritised

- a. History and geography units to be revised by curriculum leads for every year group
- b. Condensed versions of Kapow units (RE, music, computing, MFL, art and DT) to be trialled and evaluated against Edale expectations

Knowledge Organisers to be revised for all subjects to ensure they can be used effectively as monitoring tools

- a. History and geography knowledge organisers to be revised by curriculum leads and shared with staff
- b. Spring 1 and 2 monitoring to focus on using autumn's knowledge organisers to assess retention of revised curriculum
- c. Kapow and science knowledge organisers to be assessed in spring term
- d. Summer monitoring to focus on spring and autumn retention via pupil voice groups (similar to HMI process)

A spaced retrieval schedule for each subject to be established

- a. Schedule to be designed during autumn term to be launched in spring term
- b. Spring term CPD regarding spaced retrieval schedule

Continued development of all subject leaders

a. Bespoke leadership course for Edale teachers to be designed by Transform Associate and Curriculum Leads

b. Spring CPD to focus on leadership CPD
