## Parent Coffee Mornings

In our first coffee morning we asked parents what workshops they would like to support families and children. We have run several so far including anxiety and worry, supporting children's behaviour and SEND superpowers. Feedback at these has been fantastic. They have been friendly environments where parents have chatted through what they notice about their children and they have left the session with ideas on what they can try at home. We will be running a **speech and communication workshop on 21**<sup>st</sup> **February** where we will look at what is normal in speech development for children and what things we can do that most support your child to develop their speaking and understanding skills. It will be really helpful if your child is bilingual or new to speaking English as well. We will share examples of how we are supporting your children to learn English in school.

# Supporting your child's learning at home

Your child brings home reading and spellings each week. Please ensure they read their book at least 3 times a week; the more they practise, the more fluent they will become and this will support their learning in school across all areas of the curriculum.

All children in years 2-6 have a log-in for Timestables Rockstars. Please encourage your child to access the app to practise their timestables, as knowing these facts fluently supports in all aspects of maths. It is especially important in years 3 and 4 and children will take the multiplication tables check assessment in summer term of year 4. Please see your child's class teacher for more information.

### **Attendance**

Our attendance target for all children is **96%.** When children's attendance falls below this figure, it significantly impacts children's attainment at school and their ability to 'catch up' with missed learning. The more time children take off, the wider the gaps become and the harder it will be to achieve what they are capable of.

So far this year our attendance is 93.25%
